
The rebuilding of the Church resulted in the dedication of its current structure, on 28th October, 1978.

- 1925: Meeting held in Golden Lane and Surroundings.
- 1929: A Day-School was started in Orange Valley.
- 1931: Meeting started in Arima. Open Air Meeting held in Sangre Grande and Matura.
- 1946: Meeting held in Marabella.
- 1950: Establishment of the West Indies Bible Institute now West Indies Theological College.
- 1956: Open Air Meetings held in St. Charles.
- 1959: Dedication of Houston Memorial Building at La Pastora.
- 1966: Incorporation of the General Assembly of the Church of God.
- 1973: Church established in Diego Martin.
- 1974: The building in Diego Martin was completed.
- 1981: Arima Church of God was established, led by Pastor Edward and Sis. Elsie Daniel.
- 1984: Vision of a fourth (4th) Church in Mt. St. George, Tobago.
- 1995: Mt. St. George Building dedicated.
- 2012: Outreach Services in Sangre Grande led to the acquisition of property to be used as our Sanctuary.
- 2015: Meetings held in Canaan, Tobago... leading to the purchase of property and commencement of building at Canaan Farm Road, Canaan.

# Rev. Edward Arthur Cumberbatch

1873 to Wednesday 13th November, 1946

(excerpts from West Indian Gospel Trumpet Newsletter)

Rev. Edward Arthur Cumberbatch was our first full-time native Pastor (1912); ordained in 1913, and registered as a Marriage Officer in 1923.

Rev. Cumberbatch was born in Barbados in 1873 and after traveling around the West Indies for a few years, settled in Trinidad in 1905. In 1907, he gave his life to Christ, as the Word of God would reach him through the Church of God Movement in Trinidad, under the leadership of the then Missionary - Rev. George. H. Pye.

As the Church of God Movement was in its early years in Trinidad, Rev. Cumberbatch was chronicled (in the West Indian Gospel Trumpet: January-February, 1947 issue) as being among the "first fruits".

In his thirst to know more about Christ, Rev. Cumberbatch attended Theological Classes conducted by the Missionaries for three (3) years, during which time he also conducted part-time Ministerial duties.

His acceptance of God's Call to Ministry, led to his appointment to serve as Pastor in several of the Congregations in Trinidad and also in Tobago:

- ♦ 1911 to 1921: Port of Spain Congregation.
- ♦ 1921 to 1923: Princes Town Congregation.
- ♦ 1923 to 1926: Port of Spain Congregation.
- ♦ 1926 to 1927: San Fernando Congregation;


And from 1927 to the time of his passing in 1946, he served as Pastor of the three (3) Congregations in Tobago (Lambeau, Logwood Park, and Golden Lane).

The "West Indian Gospel Trumpet" Newsletter, was a publication of the Church of God (featuring the Church of God Congregations throughout the West Indies). It was noted that "up to 1942, the magazine received occasional inspiring articles from the beloved saint." A Devotional Column was eventually established in 1942 and entrusted to Rev. Cumberbatch.

Among the many things for which Rev. Cumberbatch was remembered, are the following words "a pardoned soul need not fear death, for when death makes the arrest, Christ shows the debt paid with His Own Blood".

Rev. Edward Arthur Cumberbatch had seven (7) children; among them our dearly departed Rev. Carlton Cumberbatch. His legacy lives on within the Church of God in the lives of his grandchildren and great grandchildren: Sis. Mrytle Cumberbatch continues to make melody to God on the Keyboard and Bro. Edward (Eddie) Cumberbatch's Tenor Voice always brings a peace to your heart as he sings to the honour and glory of God.

Rev. Edward Arthur Cumberbatch was also loved for his Tenor Voice, and this gift for singing is also evident in his great grandchildren Elysia and Richelle, as they raise their voices in tribute to God.

# Rev. Clinton Providence

Friday 21st June, 1946 to Wednesday 12th August, 2020

Rev. Clinton Providence or "Bro. P" as he was fondly called by many; was born in the island of St. Vincent on Friday 21st June, 1946 - the sixth (6th) of ten (10) children.

At a very young age, he gave His life to Christ, and in response to God's calling, journeyed to Trinidad and Tobago, where he attended the West Indies Bible Institute (as it was called then; now West Indies Theological College), graduating with this Bachelor in Theology.

Following his graduation, Bro. P along with his wife Beryl left for Tobago, accepting the call to Pastoral Ministry at the Church in Lambeau; where by God's Grace, they would have a powerful impact on the lives of the Membership throughout Tobago.

His ever-growing passion for Christ and his desire to serve, would also lead him to travel abroad to further his studies at Warner Southern University, where he secured his 1st Degree in Psychology & Counselling. Upon his return to Trinidad, along with his family (*Beryl, Kathyann and Noel*), Bro. P accepted the call to serve at the newly developing Church in Arima.

Bro. P's zealousness for God did not dwindle, and so he pursued his studies online with the Covington Theology Seminary, obtaining his Masters of Ministry in Christian Counselling.

Over the years, he would continue to serve the Lord, as he dedicated his time, and talents to be used by God in Ministry. He "wore many hats" and committed himself to going beyond the call of duty, to ensure the growth and development of the Church. Some of the many areas in which he served included:

- Chairman of the General Assembly of the Church of God in Trinidad and Tobago
- Lecturer and President of the West Indies Theological College
- Chairman of the Ordination and Credentials Committee
- Senior Pastor at the Church of God Centre of Ministries.

One of the young ladies that grew under Bro. P's Ministry while in Tobago is quoted as saying: "He was the most humble, inspirational, caring, supportive, spirit led and filled, exemplary teacher, best husband, best dad, best grand-dad, best uncle, cousin, brother, best pastor, best adopted dad to so many and just simply the best. He is loved and will be cherished in all our hearts."

So lasting was the impact upon the lives of the church membership, that plans were on the way in 2020 to honour Bro. and Sis. Providence at a reunion of the 'Church of God Youths of the 70s and 80s'. Covid19 and his departure from this life, altered these plans. A presentation was made to Sis. Providence by representatives of this group thereafter.

Among other things, Rev. Clinton Providence was a Man of God, Family Man, Hard-Worker, Compassionate Man, a Listener, Proud Pastor of the Church of God Centre of Ministries, a Doctrinal Pastor of Church of God Reformation Movement, a Graduate, Lecturer & President of the West Indies Theological College and a proud Vincentian.

His Legacy will live on ... as we may ever so often recall his voice, as he declared, "That's the Word."



### Heritage

Heritage is a word that we use in relationship to things

and behaviour patterns that we have inherited but what does it really mean. I would like to relate it to the Word of God.

Oxford dictionary says: for example: Property inherited. A special or individual heritage. Individual possession. An allotted portion. It ended by saying "God's love remains your heritage".

For this conversation I would like to zero in to the fact that "God's love remains your heritage". Being an inheritor, what is our expectation when we have gained ownership to this heritage.

We are to maintain its value by knowing and understanding the purpose of the inheritance which has become our heritage.

Our Christian heritage is given to us through our rebirth in Jesus Christ. From the Old Testament we see the maintenance of our heritage is by teaching the truth and values of God's instructions.

In the book of Deuteronomy 11:19. God's instructions is for us to teach his precepts to our children in our homes, when we walk along the road, when we lie down and when we get up.

Our Heritage gives answers to where we are and how we got here. In Joshua 4: 20 - 24: God told Joshua to let the people take twelve stones from the river they crossed and set it up to worship Him. He further explained when your children should ask for an explanation you must explain that: It's their crossing of the Jordan River to Dry land, as He had done for them at the Red Sea.

This heritage must be taught to the people of the earth that they may know the Hand of the Lord, that it is mighty, that you may fear the Lord your God forever.

That's our heritage.

In the New Testament, Jesus also told of our inheritance.

John 14: 3 states our Heritage in Christ: "And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with Me that you also may be where I am."

I close with this example: A few days ago, I came home feeling "under the weather". My two grandchildren JR and Athena, said one after the other "Granma don't worry, God will take care of you".

That's my heritage to my grandchildren: that they will know and experience that God will take care of us, in our situations.

God's love remains our heritage.
